Reading of the Minutes:

• The minutes for the May 2015 meeting were reviewed and unanimously approved by the Board.

Treasurer's report:

• None presented. April and May reports will be sent for review and a vote via e-mail.

Chronicle Editor's report (Mailings in March, May, June, July, August, and October):

• The July mailing was sent out. The next mailing is scheduled to go out in August. Submissions are always welcome by the editor.

Rental Report:

- Shelley reported the clubhouse was booked solid in July for Saturday and Sundays. She has even had Fridays booked.
- Brad discussed an issue that has come up regarding renters of the clubhouse wanting to swim. Brad clarified that our policy is to allow guests of renters to swim after paying guest fees for their swimmers.
 - Sue feels this is an issue due to staffing issues with the pool. Her staff needs to know ahead of time how many people from the party will be swimming in order to have enough lifeguards. Additionally, Sue is concerned wet patrons may slip on the floor of the clubhouse.
- There was a long discussion over making some changes to the rental contract to clarify that the rental fee for the clubhouse does not include all guests being able to swim. Renters will need to establish a guest list for signing in with the managers. They will need to pay a gate fee of \$2 per guest if they use the pool. Brad will take recommendations for the language in the contract via e-mail.
- Shelley recommended a sign be posted on the gate with the party reservation rule for the pool. It was pointed out that members might only bring a maximum of 10 guests with them without booking a party at the pool. A motion was passed to have a sign placed on the front gate related to the maximum number of guests members may bring in, and reminding those who rent the clubhouse their rental fee does not include swimming.
- Shelley asked that all rental inquiries be directed to her cabana club e-mail: rentals@creeksidecabanaclub.com.

Pool Manager's report:

- Sue reported she is working well with Ivonne on getting payroll completed by using the new payroll system.
- Evaluations for staff were completed for the mid season.
- The managers got rid of the "call in" shift for lifeguards. They now call in the 4-8 shift early and have the 12-4 shift hold over if they need extra staff. This practice was well received by staff and has worked out well.
- Sue would like to order three lifeguard umbrellas. She was directed to order them.
- A bigger dumpster was ordered and it helped with the overflow of garbage the facility has recently seen. Sue would like renters to be reminded to place the garbage in the dumpster and not just around the dumpster as some have done.
- Sue is looking for clarification on whose responsibility it is to stock the bathrooms in the clubhouse during the season. The Board explained it is staff's responsibility during the season if supplies are needed after the janitor cleans.
- A new dolly needs to be purchased. Sue was directed to order one.
- A Safety Inspection was completed this week by a County inspector. He only pointed out that a few signs need to be ordered. Brad directed Sue to order the signs through Leslie's Pool Supplies.
- Glass has been broken four times this season around the pool. They are trying to enforce the "no glass rule." Sue would like a reminder put out to all members that glass bottles are not allowed at the facility. Shawn and Brad pointed out that the rule is meant to mean that while glass bottles are not allowed, members may pour their drinks into plastic cups (for those who brought wine or glass beer bottles) The bottles must then be stored away.

Swim Team Report:

- Angela and Scott and Cindy Farstad are next season's Parent Reps. The swim team finished in 6th place again this season. The team had good sportsmanship during the Champs Meet. The swim socials went well and were well attended. Trey broke an "all time record" for butterfly. Brianna broke "all time records" for butterfly and back stroke. Laura Powers broke "all time records" for free style and backstroke. Nicole Rogy broke an "all time record" for breast stroke.
- Things to look into for next year are alternative scoring. We have brought this up twice in the past to the league, but this year two other teams approached us to try this avenue again.
- Angela inquired about not having bookings in the clubhouse on the same nights the Swim Team has functions due to both parties ending up having D.J.s that have music competing with each other. Shelley pointed out that she always asks the Swim Team which weekends to block off in January. If the team does not ask for the clubhouse for a specific day, the rental is allowed. Shawn pointed out that the team's D.J.'d event this year was not pre-planned.
- The Swim Team did a questionnaire regarding suggested changes or improvements to the team. Members overwhelming are interested in having some sort of year round team here at the pool.
- Shawn gave an overview of the team's finances and fundraising efforts for the year.

Associate Membership Chairperson:

• Pat has resigned. We need to advertise in the Chronicle for a new chairperson.

Facility Report:

• Ivonne will order new paper towel dispensers and possibly toilet paper dispensers for the bathrooms.

Old business:

Capital Improvements that have been completed in the last 15 years: Roofs for both buildings, new windows, all buildings were painted, ½ of the pool deck's concrete was replaced, the Racing Pool was re-plastered and the steps were put in, pool heaters have been replaced several times, the brick BBQs were rebuilt, the Clubhouse had recessed lighting installed, the floor of the Clubhouse was replaced, the fences have been mended, a new diving board was purchased, a concrete walkway was installed, new shades were purchased for the windows, several landscaping issues were addressed, the palm tree was removed, the pool pumps were replaced, a new stove was purchased, new refrigerators were purchased, several new toilets were purchased, new bathroom partitions were purchased, new chairs in the clubhouse were purchased, new lounge chairs around the pool were purchased, and new umbrellas for the facility were purchased.

New business:

• A motion was passed to purchase four new chaise lounges from Costco. Sally is to make the purchases.

Adjournment:

The meeting was adjourned at 9:37 p.m.
