





We Have Ourselves Six New Creekside Dragon Cloud Dojo Black Belts!

Congratulations are in order for these 6 dedicated Black Belts! Becoming and being a Dragon Cloud Black Belt is a title that is definitely earned and is greatly respected.

Our 5 youth Black Belts, **Justin, Andrew, Aryak, Adith and Pranav**, all started their training between the ages of 5 and 7! These young men have persevered over many years of training. Candidates have to be 16 years of age in order to test to be a Black Belt. Our Dragon Cloud Black Belts are also certified to teach at that age. Anyone who achieves their Black Belt under the age of 16, is considered a Junior Black Belt.

Our adult Black Belt, **Doug**, has been diligently practicing the martial arts for 6 years.

Students had to first take a 2 hour written test followed by a rigorous 8 hour physical test the next day. The physical test takes a great deal of endurance, dedication and strong emotional stability to finish and pushes the student to their limit. The test consists of the following: 2 hours of basics which include punches, blocks, handstrikes and kicks, a total of 15 of all the Kata's (forms), Kobudo (weapons) which include the Bo Staff and Sai's, a total of 30 striking and grabbing techniques and last but not least breaking a total of 12 boards using 4 types of breaks, fist, handstrike, elbow, and kick and using 3 boards for each break. The last part of the physical test is the obstacle course. This consists of several stations and is a **timed** test. The stations include jumping, rolling, diving, breaking, putting out a candle with 4 strikes, retrieving a metal washer from a container of steel ball bearings and performing a kata on a 6 inch balance beam.

Congratulations to these **OUTSTANDING** new Black Belts who are now just beginning a new path in their martial arts journey!




Creekside National Night Out 2018
