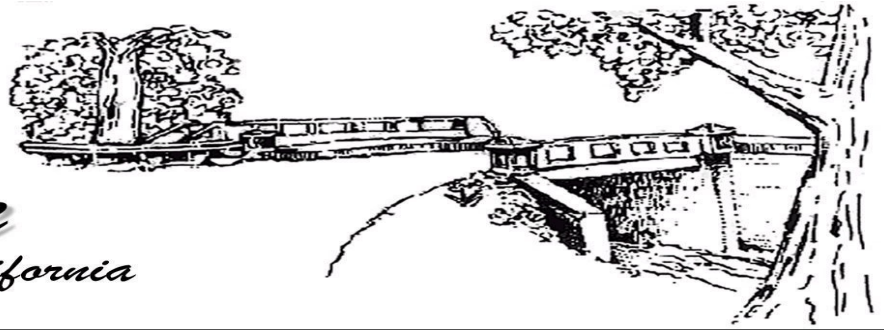

September is National Preparedness Month and the theme for this year is “**Prepared, Not Scared**”! With all the natural disasters we encounter year after year, National Preparedness Month is meant to promote family and community disaster and emergency planning now and throughout the year. Are you ready? The following are some things to think about when answering this question. First, try to save early for disaster

costs by planning financially for the possibility of a disaster. Second, make an emergency plan and practice it today as well as signing up for alerts and warnings in your area. This includes building an emergency kit which should at minimum contain the following items: one gallon of water per person per day to last at least three days, at least a three day supply of non-perishable food, battery-powered or hand crank radio, a NOAA weather radio with tone alert, a flashlight, a first aid kit, extra batteries, a whistle, dust masks, moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation, a wrench or pliers to turn off utilities, a manual can opener for food, local maps and a cell phone with chargers and a backup battery. Third, include kids in the disaster planning process by teaching them what to do in an emergency as well as how to communicate during an emergency. Finally, get involved in your community’s preparedness by doing such things as taking classes in lifesaving skills such as CPR/AED and first aid as well as by checking in with your neighbors to see how you can help each other out before and after a storm. 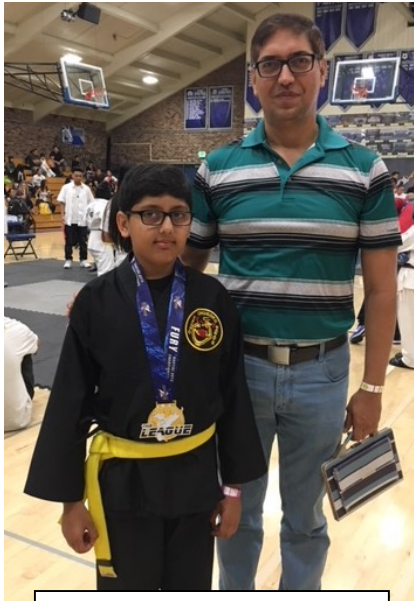

“The Fury” Karate Tournament

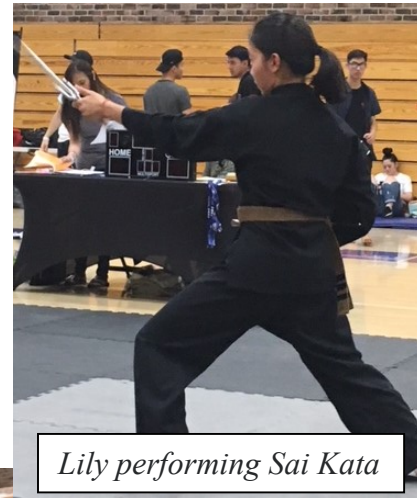

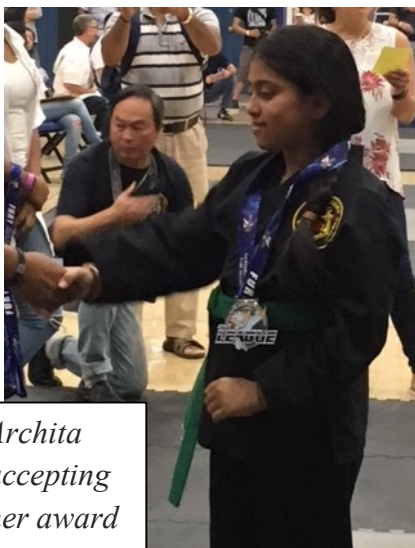

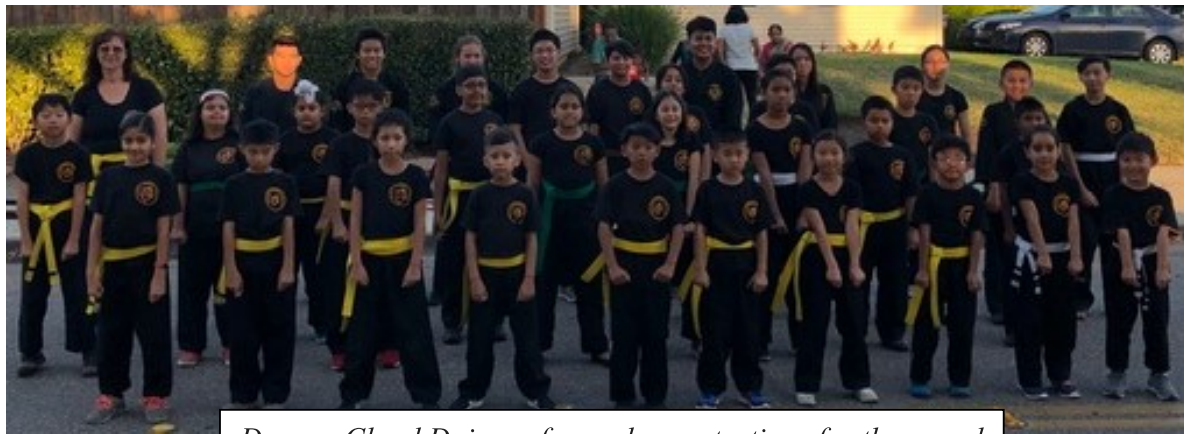
