West Valley Branch Teen Room Art Contest: Are you someone 13 to 17 years old that has a passion for art? If so, put your creative skills to use by entering your original work in a contest to display your art in West Valley Branch Library's Teen Room for decoration! Artwork can be submitted either digitally in a PDF or JPEG format in an email to jessica.chung@sjlibrary.org or on paper to staff at the West Valley Branch

Library during open hours. The deadline to turn your completed form and artwork submission in by is **Saturday**, **April 2**, **at 6 pm** and late entries will not be accepted. Entries submitted must be suitable for a general audience, including children. If entering art as a team of artists/illustrators, make sure to have **only one member** of your team register online since only **50 unique submissions maximum** will be accepted. The top three winners and up to two Honorable Mentions will be notified by e-mail or phone if they won by Monday, May 9, 2022. Winning entries and Honorable Mentions will have their artwork printed and displayed in the Teen Room at West Valley Branch Library. To register and fill out the contest entry form to submit with your artwork, either on paper or digitally, go to their website at https://sipl.bibliocommons.com/events and search 'West Valley Branch Teen Room Art Contest'.

East Side Dreams Art Contest: Feeling artistic? If so, help us celebrate East Side San José's history with your artwork! Artwork submitted MUST focus around East Side San José history and culture from the 1950's to the 1990's. Examples of sample topics can include but are not limited to activism, organizing and protest, community figures and leaders, area development and businesses, churches and community

organizations, agriculture and canneries, migrant workers, lowriding and murals and art. There is a limit of one entry per contestant and it must be the creative and original artwork of the entrant. Minor must have parent/guardian consent and computer generated images are acceptable provided they are your work and NO clip art. There will be two winners, one in the ages 13 and under category who will win a \$100 gift card, and the other winner in the ages 14 and older category who will win a \$200 gift card as well as have their artwork made into a special limited edition library card! In addition, both winners' artwork will be showcased at the upcoming East Side Dreams exhibit taking place July to September 2022, at the King Library, and on San José Public Library's website. Entries can be made either physically by handing it to a staff member at any San José Public Library location or digitally online and must be submitted by **6 pm on Friday, April 8, 2022**. Winners will be determined by library staff vote and notified during the week of April 18, 2022. Virtual Homework Club for K-8 Students

Do you have a child in kindergarten through 8th grade that needs help with their homework? If so, K-8 students can sign up for San Jose Public Library's (SJPL) Virtual Homework Club to be matched with skilled volunteer coaches. Students can get help with their homework in subjects including reading, writing, math, social studies, science, and more! This program is offered throughout the school year until March 30, 2022, in partnership with the Resilience Corps Learning Pathway Program. It takes place online through Zoom Monday through Thursday from 4 PM to 5 PM except during school breaks and holidays. This program is FREE, but registration is required. If you are registering multiple children, you need to indicate the number of children. After you have registered, you will receive an email with a link to a survey. If this is the student's first time attending the Virtual Homework Club, you MUST complete the survey to finish your registration. The Zoom link and password are then sent on the day of the event to **registered attendees only** in order to ensure that all registrants will be able to work with a homework coach. To protect participant privacy, these sessions are **not** recorded. Internet access and the Zoom app or web app are required to participate and a laptop or desktop computer with a webcam and microphone is recommended. Assistance in languages other than English may be provided based on volunteers' availability. SJPL gives priority registration to students either residing or attending school in San Jose and students from outside San Jose may be admitted to the Virtual Homework Club but only if there are slots available. UNLEASH YOUR CREATIVE SIDE



Spring Into Writing With Short Edition: March is here, the first month of spring! Do you feel inspired by the warming weather and renewing life and are eager to write a story or poem about it? If your creativity is of a literary

bent, San José Public Library invites writers of all ages and backgrounds to submit their original short stories and poems **anytime throughout the year** through San José Public Library's Short Edition platform. If accepted, your work will join other stories and poems from our community to create a rich reflection of our collective voices and imaginations! These works will build a local collection which is available online through the San José Public Library short story portal for the community's reading and enjoyment! The short edition short story submission guidelines for this are:

- > Submissions from established and emerging writers alike are welcome and you may use a pen name.
- > Submissions must be short stories or poems with a **maximum of 8,000 characters**, **spaces included**. Anything longer than that will **not** be accepted.
- ➤ Only fictional works are accepted, though stories and poems may be based on personal lived experiences. While they may be in any style or genre, they should be appropriate for diverse audiences.
- ➤ Works must be stand-alone, not part of a series of installments.
- Account creation is required, and all submissions should be submitted via the Short Edition submission portal in a copy/paste format at https://www.sipl.org/eresource/short-edition.
- > Submissions are ongoing, with no deadline. There are also special contests which are held periodically and have deadlines such as the Poetry Contest in April and Short Story Contest in September.
- Works must be previously unpublished in print or online, including on personal blogs.
- ➤ Please be patient as it may take anywhere from a few days to a few weeks for you to hear back from the library, depending on the number of submissions they receive! The library will let you know their decision at the email address you have used to create your Short Edition account.

Enjoy writing but need help getting your creative juices flowing or having a case of writer's block? Then here are some story/poem prompts inspired by a few of the events in March to get you thinking about what things you can write about:

- ➤ **Women's History Month:** Write a poem or short story inspired by the achievements of women in American history. Read about their stories and write a fictional account of a real or imagined moment in the life of a particular figure.
- ➤ Daylight Savings Time (Sunday, March 13): Uh-oh, we lose an hour in the spring, don't we? Think of a character whose life gets thrown topsy-turvy because they forgot about the time change. Maybe they missed an important meeting, appointment, or event? How might things spiral out of control for them? Or how is their life made better?
- > St. Patrick's Day (Thursday, March 17): Write a story or poem that's inspired by Irish folklore, Irish history, or the story of Irish immigration to America.
- > **Spring Equinox (Sunday, March 20):** The vernal equinox marks the beginning of spring. What sorts of things do you notice as the temperature warms and the days grow longer? What is the weather like? How does spring make you feel? Write a poem inspired by your reflections on the changes in nature that spring brings.

<u>Author's Corner for Teen Writers:</u> Teen writers, have you heard about Author's Corner? If not, come check us out! Author's Corner is a monthly, informal creative writing club to help support teens who are considering a career as an author and want to get feedback on their work, teens who want to build portfolios for creative writing programs, and any teen who's working on a piece of creative writing.

Teen Crash Course in Creative Writing: The San José Public Library is also offering a 'Teen Crash Course in Creative Writing'. If your dream is to become a published author or just to write, join us on Saturday afternoons for a FREE, six-week virtual course on different aspects of writing (started February 26, 2022, and runs through April 2, 2022, from 2 pm - 4 pm). This program is for high school and middle school students, ages 11-18 and each class is taught by a different professional author. You can pick and choose which ones of the 6 sessions you would like to attend or attend them all!

Board of Directors Meeting January 19, 2022 Meeting Minutes

Associate Membership Chairperson's report:

We intend to sell associate memberships this season for \$475 which is a 5% increase in accordance with the same increase levied on the HOA dues. Members will NOT be receiving renewal notifications via standard mail starting this year. Rather, we will continue to use the online registration system, which will allow members to update all emergency contact forms, the policy agreement, and submit payment. March 14, 2022, will be the absolute deadline to renew, as we have many interested families on our waiting list now. Memberships will not renew unless all forms and contact information are filled out completely.

Pool Manager's report:

We are planning for a full season as we used to pre-pandemic. The job openings have been posted on the website with a deadline to apply by February 18, 2022. Interviews will be held on March 5th and 6th. There has been a minimum wage increase to \$16.20 per hour and our pay scales will be adjusted accordingly. Ivonne plans to raise the price for swim lessons based on a survey of the average cost for swim lessons in our area that she will be conducting.

Swim Team Report:

The swim team league has voted to return to in person dual meets. The non-member fee that was charged to participants for the winter conditioning program does not apply to the regular swim team season because families must be homeowners or associate members to participate. We also discussed the swim team's reimbursements to the HOA for heating the pool during the season when the club is not open to homeowners and associate members. Historically, the swim team season and the Cabana Club's recreational season were always aligned. However, when the winter conditioning program was added to the schedule, it was recognized that heating the pool during the coldest months of the season would be expensive and it was agreed that the swim team would cover this expense.

Facility Report:

One of the pool heaters is in the process of being serviced. If it's able to be repaired, then it will be back online by January 21, 2022. We got our first estimate of \$280,000 from a contractor in response to our bid for the remodel of the front entrance, four bathrooms, ramps into the buildings and the relocation of the shower for ADA compliance. \$150,000 of this will be able to be paid from our reserve fund. For the balance owed, we discussed the option of a one-time special assessment of \$300 which could be paid in two installments. We also discussed getting a loan for the balance and then paying it off with a special assessment spread out over an agreed upon period of time. Daniel will do some additional research and report back.

New business:

It was voted to deny the request for the 3843 YB property fee waiver. It was also voted to approve the request to waive the interest fees on Panuaco but unfortunately, we can't waive the other fees because those are not directly charged by the HOA and are the collection processor's fees. Finally, it was voted to change the trigger date for the HOA dues late fee to 60 days from the date of the invoice.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 p.m. Minutes prepared by Brad Geldert.

Note: The Creekside Homeowners Association board meets 6 times a year on the 3rd Wednesday of the odd numbered months and all homeowners are welcome to attend. Meetings usually start at 7 PM and it is your chance as a homeowner to hear items being discussed and raise any concerns you may have. The next meeting will take place on Wednesday March 16, 2022.
